

In order to clear the main line that runs beneath it, the tracks at this mountaintop community must rise no less than 5½ inches above the layout surface.

CITY

Two or more populated areas, such as this small urban center, give a model train layout a purpose by providing logical destinations for passengers and freight. Small details (parking meters, construction workers, cars and trucks, etc.) help bring the scene to life.



The Industrial area

includes two widely spaced sidings. They provide plenty of room for large operating accessories, such as log and coal loaders, an oil terminal, and manufacturing facilities.
