

# The Boron train-order station in 1:29 scale

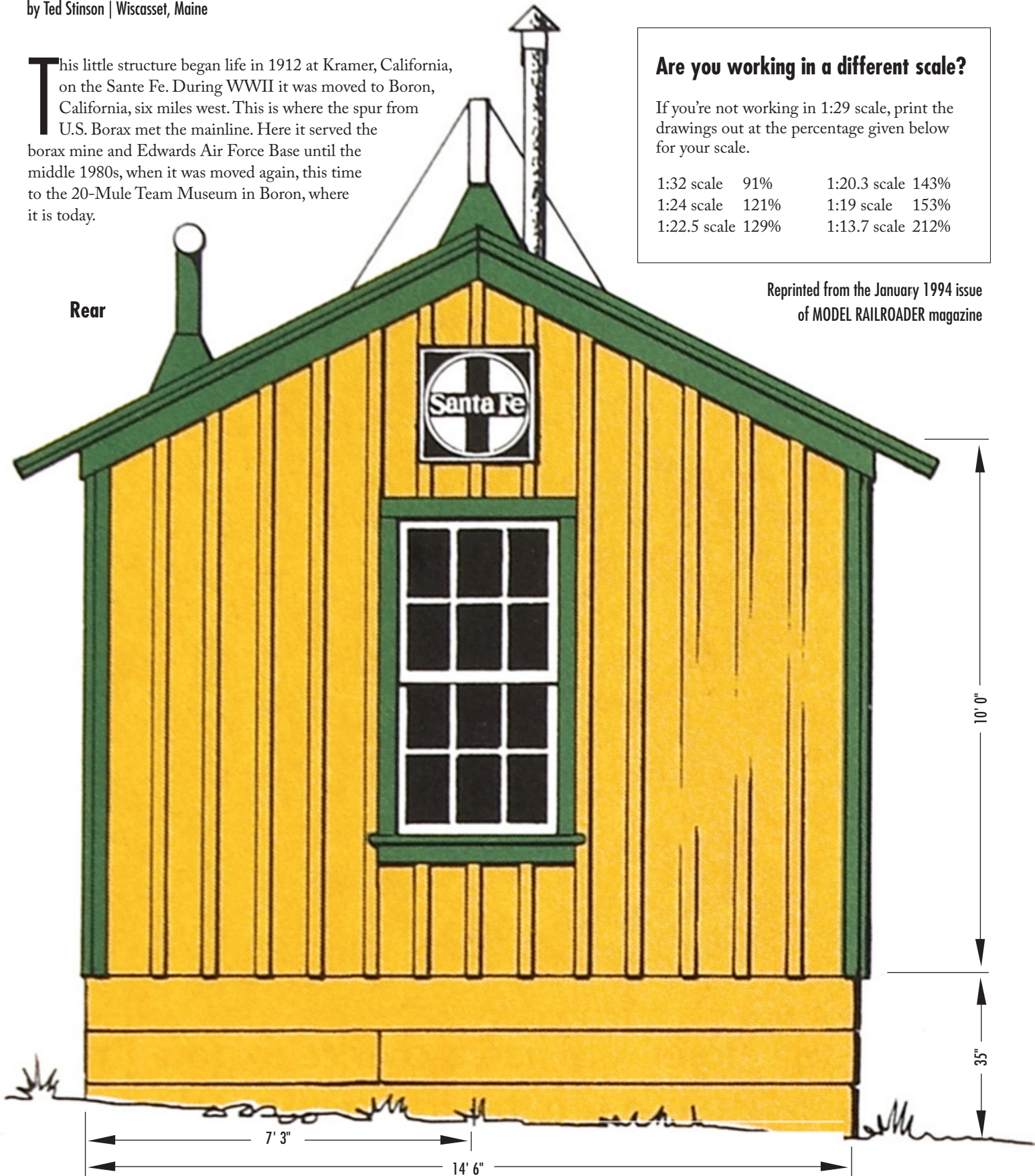
This little structure began life in 1912 at Kramer, California, on the Santa Fe. During WWII it was moved to Boron, California, six miles west. This is where the spur from U.S. Borax met the mainline. Here it served the borax mine and Edwards Air Force Base until the middle 1980s, when it was moved again, this time to the 20-Mule Team Museum in Boron, where it is today.

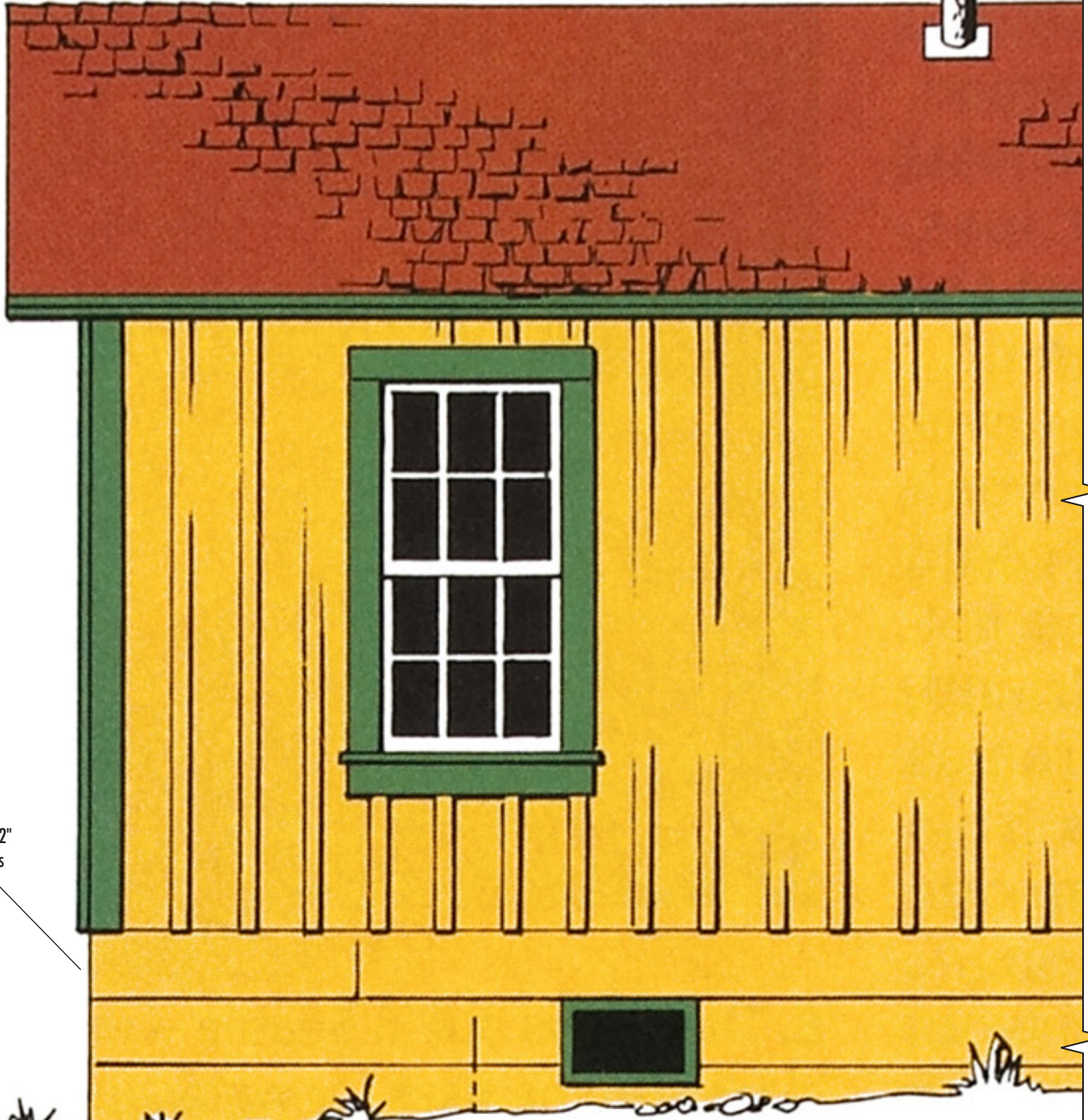
